

# College Application Timeline

# Junior Year: Spring

#### March - May:

- Initial College Research: Begin exploring colleges that align with your academic interests, extracurricular activities, and personal preferences.
- Create a Preliminary List: Compile a list of potential colleges (reach, target, and safety schools). Aim for a
  diverse range of options.
- **Standardized Test Prep:** Start preparing for the SAT or ACT. Take **practice tests** to identify areas for improvement. Consider enrolling in a test prep course or using online resources.
- Extracurricular Involvement: Continue to actively participate in extracurricular activities and seek leadership roles if possible.
- Talk to a Counselor: Schedule a meeting with your high school counselor to discuss your college plans and academic progress. For more personalized, hands-on help with your application, book a session with Apex Academics to discuss options and next steps.
- College Visits: College visits at this point in the process can help you get a sense of the type of school you'd like to apply to (size, culture, location).

# Junior Year: Summer

#### June - August:

- College Visits: If possible, visit colleges that are high on your list during the school year. However, Summer is a great time to attend information sessions and take campus tours that align with your schedule, as well as connecting with admissions counselors to set up interviews for the Fall.
- Standardized Testing: Take the SAT or ACT for the first time. Register early to secure your preferred test date and location. You can always take the tests more than once.
- Begin Essay Brainstorming: Start thinking about potential essay topics. Reflect on your experiences, values, and goals. Consider what makes you unique and what you want to convey to colleges.
- Research Scholarships & Financial Aid: Explore scholarship opportunities and learn about the FAFSA and CSS Profile. Understand the financial aid process.
- Summer Programs/Activities: Participate in summer programs, internships, volunteer work, or other activities
  that demonstrate your interests and skills.

• Begin building portfolio items: Craft a resume that reflects your experiences and skills. Create a common app account and familiarize yourself with what you need for your application,

## Senior Year: Fall

#### September - October:

- College Visits: Visit colleges that are high on your list during the school year in order to get a better sense of the campus culture. Attend information sessions, book campus tours, audit an interesting class, and perhaps connect with an admissions counselor!
- Finalize College List: Narrow down your college list and finalize your reach, target, and safety schools. Double-check application deadlines.
- Request Letters of Recommendation: Ask teachers and counselors for letters of recommendation. Provide them with your resume, transcript, and a brief statement of your goals.
- Essay Drafting & Revision: Write and revise your college essays. Seek feedback from teachers, counselors, and trusted adults.
- Complete Applications: Fill out college applications carefully and accurately. Pay attention to deadlines and requirements.
- Standardized Testing (If needed): Retake the SAT or ACT if you are not satisfied with your previous scores.
- Financial Aid Applications: Complete the FAFSA and CSS Profile as soon as they become available (usually in October). Look into merit-based scholarships, fellowships, and grants available at each college/university.
- Submit Applications: Submit your college applications before the deadlines. Double-check that you have included all required documents.

#### November - December:

- Continue Submitting Applications: Prioritize completing all applications. Regularly check each school's application portal to see if anything is missing. Some schools may have earlier deadlines than others.
- Monitor Application Status: Keep track of your application status online. Ensure that all required documents have been received.
- Prepare for Interviews (If applicable): Practice answering common interview questions. Dress professionally and be prepared to discuss your interests and goals.

# Senior Year: Winter/Spring

## January - April:

- Receive Admission Decisions: Colleges will begin releasing admission decisions. Check your email and online portals regularly.
- Compare Financial Aid Packages: Carefully review financial aid offers from each college. Compare the amounts of grants, loans, and work-study options in order to find the right option for you.
- Visit Admitted Student Days (Optional): Attend admitted student days at colleges you are seriously considering. This is a great opportunity to learn more about the campus and meet current students.
- Make a Decision: Choose the college that is the best fit for you academically, financially, and personally!
